Subject: Cooke DNA

Dear Ms. Saario,

We are trying to locate a male Cooke descendant from Frances Cooke who would be willing to share his DNA. The cost of the DNA test would be at our expense. My husband and I both belong to the Mayflower Society and are your cousins.

The results of this DNA test would prove if our Cook ancestors are related to Frances Cooke who came on the Mayflower ship in 1620. Both Cooke families lived in the same area and never intermarried. The genealogists say that they could find no written evidence that these two Cooke lineages were related.

The Y chromosome of a male is handed down from father to son, unchanged, from generation to generation. We obtained the DNA from Howard's (my husband) cousin, Delmar Cook who lives in Du fur, Oregon. Delmar's Y chromosome is the same as Howard's (Bill's) grandfather, Benjamin Cook's (b.1886-1936) Y chromosome. Delmar's DNA sample says that he belongs to Haploid J2 (M172). This would also be Benjamin Cook's Haplogroup.

Mark (our son) and Howard (Bill) are actively trying to find a male Cook who directly descends from Frances Cooke to obtain a sample of his DNA. Then we can compare the DNA Y chromosome sequence from Delmar against the DNA sequence of the direct male descendant of Frances Cooke. This would give us the information to know if Howard and Mark's Cook line comes from the same family as Frances Cooke of the Mayflower and if they/we originate from the same Cook family.

Thank you for your time and trouble. If we can find a DNA donor then we would be able to share our findings with others that might find it very interesting and answer some of the questions regarding the Cooke family of the Mayflower. Can you help us?
