I want to share with you information about our booklet: ***Pilgrims: Then and Now***  
In 1990 the Pennsylvania Society sponsored its own publication about the Pilgrims and how their covenant concept "played a major role in the formation of the church to which they pledged mutual aid in the care of one another." Their similar pledge with the Native Americans promoted peace for fifty-five years. Thousands of copies have been distributed to Pennsylvania schools, scout groups, etc. as well as each new SMDPA member. This illustrated 34 page booklet (cover in color) was written by The Rev. Gary L. Marks, current senior pastor of the Church of the Pilgrimage (UCC) in Plymouth, MA. He is a recognized scholar of the Pilgrims' pastor John Robinson. His church and the First Parish Church in Plymouth alternate as host for the GSMD Triennial Congress opening sessions. Sales of the booklet are a major fund raiser for our educational programs. This issue is mainly devoted to all things about our American **Thanksgiving** Holiday. This holiday started with the fall celebration Pilgrim Frances Cooke and his son John celebrated 388 years ago in what became Plymouth, MA.

They and 138 others (ninety of whom had table manners very different from their English Pilgrim hosts) did not intentionally plan for the first **Thanksgiving** held in New England to become America's national **Thanksgiving** Celebration. But it did!

Much can be learned from reading, ***Thanksgiving: The Pilgrims First Year in America*** by Glenn Alan Cheney; more on this book below.

There is another very interesting book just published by one of our newest members, Beverly Pierce Stroebel, entitled, ***Full Sail-A 21<sup>st</sup> Century Spiritual Cruise on Board The Mayflower*** I can not wait to read Beverly's book. More on this book below, also.

The settlement of New England began when the Mayflower landed in 1621 and when it left in the spring of 1621. Frances Cooke and his fellow Plimoth Plantation residents learned how to build and sustain a life for themselves. Their actions combined with the knowledge and survival skills learned from the Wampanoag Native Americans were the models used by other English immigrants that followed them to that region. A new society & culture developed in New England that was very different from the planters of the coastal Atlantic seaboard and the mainly Scots-Irish families that settled in the interior territory along the Appalachian mountain range.

One has to remember that when the Mayflower pulled up anchor and sailed back to England, not one Englishman elected to return to their old homeland.

When the Mayflower sailed back to England, our Forefathers became English American immigrants allied with their Native American Wampanoag neighbors.

Today, we remember them as Pilgrims.

### *Thanksgiving: The Pilgrims' First Year in America*

I recently purchased this book at the 2009 SMDNC annual meeting hosted this year by the Charlotte Colony in Charlotte, NC.
